We all know that 'college is a medium that strengthens the foundation of all-round development and through it generations of citizens with character are created. Shri Sharda Bhavan Education Society's Yeshwant Mahavidyalaya has been carrying out this pious work with utmost sincerity for the last six decades.

Established on June 15, 1963, Yeshwant Mahavidyalaya is one of the important colleges in Marathwada offering quality education in all the three disciplines, namely, Arts, Commerce and Science. It offers 07 Undergraduate and 18 Postgraduate courses and Ph.D. in 21 subjects with 21 Research Centres. The college has a magnificent campus which can accommodate about 9000 students at a time.

The college has been awarded "A" status by the 'NAAC' Committee three times in 2003, 2010 and 2016 and has been honoured by the University Grants Commission as a "College of Potential with Excellence (CPE)".

The college was selected in 2019 by the University Grants Commission for its prestigious Counselling Scheme "PARAMARSH". The scheme has been implemented very effectively by the college and so far six colleges have completed the NAAC assessment process under its guidance.

Leading in implementation of 'Green Campus', 'Environmental Awareness Activities', the college has been honoured with the "District Green Champion Award- 2021" by the 'Mahatma Gandhi Council of Rural Education' and the 'Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Government of

India'.

In order to involve higher educational institutions in the development of rural India, the former 'Ministry of Human Resource Development and the present 'Ministry of Education, Government of India' has included the college as a participating institution under the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan campaign and the college is in the forefront in the effective implementation of this campaign by adopting five villages namely Waghi, Pimpalgaon, Naleshwar, Rahati and Kotitirtha.

The college has developed two updated software-'Access Stock Management System' and 'IQAC Information Management System' and it is pleasing to say that students have been at the forefront of developing them.

In the adverse period of Corona pandemic, the Marathi department has taken initiative to develop personality of the students by making effective use of television system under the **'Vachankatta'** campaign by conducting various creative programs related to the four fields-literature, film, folk-culture and industry. In this way, Yeshwant Mahavidyalaya has been instrumental in bridging the educational backlog in the rural areas by providing new opportunities for quality education to the students.

We all know that College life is the blissful period of a person's life. During this period the process of acquiring knowledge takes place in the college and on the other hand, the process of socialization takes place through the experiences in the hostel. With this awareness, alumni have been actively involved in the establishment of world universities such as Oxford, Cambridge, Stanford and reputed IITs in India.

The hostel is a 'Second Home' for students from economically disadvantaged regions like Marathwada. Children from hard working communities like peasants, farmers, labourers, come to cities like Nanded with the dream of getting higher education; but due to financial constraints, their parents have to face endless difficulties while keeping their children in the city for education. In this case, the college dormitory gives them a major support.



The hostel of Yeshwant Mahavidyalaya has faithfully worked for many years to provide 'Entitled Shelter' to thousands of students in rural areas. But due to dilapidation, the boys' hostel has been demolished, which is a great inconvenience to students in rural areas. Specially, since the Corona pendamic has caused many students to lose their parents in the last two years, it has become very important to provide them with financial and psychological support.

As the University Grants Commission has presently ceased funding for college boys' hostels, it has become necessary to rebuild it through public participation.

Considering this fact, Heramb Kulkarni (Finland), a senior education expert at the Alumni Meet held on July 25, 2021, described the role of alumni in the process of higher education and appealed to the alumni to come forward.

Responding to this call, the alumni undertook the task of 'raising funds' to rebuild the hostel to alleviate the inconvenience of the students. And it has received a spontaneous response in a short period of time and many alumni are voluntarily and happily coming forward for financial contributions and making significant contributions to the bank account of the alumni association.

In fact, it is our duty to have the same devoutness towards the Temple of knowledge as we have for the temple of deities. This is to say, just as we donate for the restoration of old temples over time with 'generous hands', we also feel to do so for the restoration of the temples of knowledge; but we don't get the opportunity to embody that feeling.
